We can work to get additional signage out on 27 to warn the traveling public on 27 about the intersection. We have to do that regardless to retrain people who use that road that there will now be more traffic entering and exiting that roadway. We will also put out lots of info to inform the public that it is now a public road. We can have a discussion later this weekend when I get back from the conference. It will be really hard to reconfigure the intersection given that we are acquiring a very specific strip of land. I've been working to acquire this road for the last 7 years and the comment about it not becoming public because of safety concerns is the first I've heard.

Hi Mike,

I just got off the phone with Dorris Mayhan. Her property is on the east side of Hwy 27 (it's the first house south of the ash pit). She had some good feedback regarding the intersection circled below. Apparently, it's extremely difficult to see trucks hauling ash coming from the north. She said you really have to gun it if you're taking a left at the intersection (heading south on the Haul Road). She also mentioned that the Haul Road was closed to the public historically because of this safety concern:
