**RESOLUTION #87-P-006 Special Use
Permit for Gravel Pit and Concrete

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Routt, State of Colorado, hereinafter referred to as the "Board" has duly received a petition from the Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District for a Special Use Permit for a gravel pit and concrete batch plant on land zoned Agriculture/Forestry (A/F);

WHEREAS, all necessary data has been submitted and all required fees have been paid on behalf of the petitioner;

WHEREAS, the petition was reviewed by the Routt County Regional Planning Commission on December 18, 1986, and an advisory report was submitted to the Board prior to the public hearing recommending approval with the following conditions:

Standard Conditions

1. A certificate of liability insurance for a minimum of \$500,000 shall be posted to cover any damages to public and private property, and Routt County shall be named as an additional insured.
2. County roads used for the hauling of minerals must be able to accommodate the proposed additional traffic. All haulage roads must have adequate signage at intersections and any other locations that may require additional signage. All relocated county roads must have adequate dedicated right-of-way and must meet, at minimum, the Routt County Road Standards.
3. All road and bridge repair and maintenance agreements made with Routt County prior to permit issuance must be adhered to.
4. The special use permit is limited to uses and facilities presented in the original project plan. Any additional uses or facilities must be applied for in a new or amended application.
5. The special use permit is valid for the life of the or until termination of active production, provided it is acted upon within two (2) years of approval.
6. The operation may be reviewed by Planning Staff annually to ensure that all conditions of the permit are being complied with.
7. Any complaints or concerns which may arise from this operation may be cause for review of the Special Use Permit, at any time, and amendment or addition of conditions, or revocation of the permit if necessary.
8. Hauling shall take place along on-site roads when possible.
9. Sanitary facilities are to be located on or near the extraction site.
10. Routt County has the authority to close any county road at their discretion, if such road surface is in poor condition and would be further damaged by additional use.
11. The permittee shall apply for and receive a Mined Land Reclamation Board permit if required and post a reclamation bond with the ~~MLRB~~ prior to commencing any operations. The permittee shall be responsible for reclamation as set forth by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation guidelines.

12. Weed control shall be exercised on the property as necessary and at least once per year.

Specific Conditions

1. The batch plant, crusher and gravel pit shall comply with all applicable Federal and State regulations for emissions, noise and odors.
2. A dust control plan shall be submitted to Planning Staff, along with emission permits from the Colorado Department of Health, Air Quality Control Division.
3. Noise levels, smoke, odors, heat, and vibration shall not exceed limits set by section 8.4 of the Routt County Zoning Resolution.
4. The groundwater table at the site must be protected from pollutants. Review by the County and State Health Departments may indicate the need for an impervious liner to be placed in the settling pond or some other method of groundwater protection may be necessary. Final plans shall be submitted to planning staff.
5. Hours shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday.
6. Equipment and stockpiles in the gravel pit shall be placed and/or anchored to prevent them from floating downstream in the event of a flood.
7. The Special Use Permit is for the purpose of the Stagecoach Reservoir project construction only.
8. The Special Use Permit is valid for two years.
9. Specific plans, as developed by the contractor, for sediment control and hazardous or oily substance control shall be submitted to Planning Staff prior to construction.

WHEREAS, the Board held a public hearing on the matter on January 27, 1987, notice of said hearing having been advertised according to law;

WHEREAS, the Board reviewed the staff report and Planning Commission recommendations on the proposal, heard an overview from the petitioner of the planned construction of the Stagecoach Reservoir and testimony that the project would be for the dam and associated roads, and the Board discussed frazil ice, restoration of the gravel pit if the project fails, and development of county roads in the area, and received no comments from the public on the matter;

WHEREAS, Commissioner Fisher moved to approve the Special Use Permit subject to conditions as set forth below, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Dorr and was approved unanimously by the Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board approves the Special Use Permit for the Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District to mine gravel and

Standard Conditions

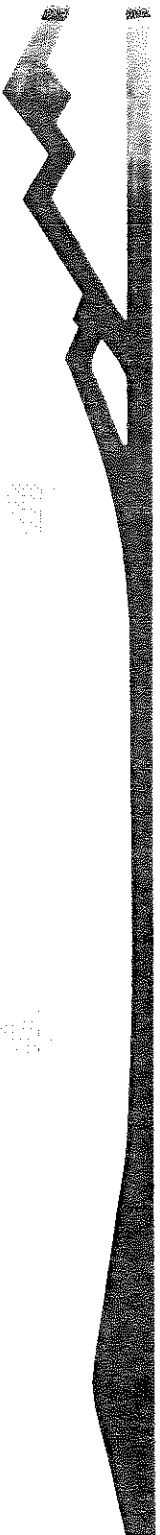

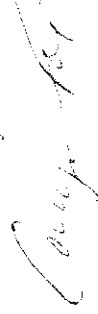

Mr. Zender explained that there is twelve million dollars available for the ten state region. There are over 900 counties that qualify for assistance. In order to receive assistance, the County must request assistance and turn in an application of proposed projects to the USEDA. Each request is funded on its own merit. The purpose of the programs is to create new jobs, or better jobs for the area.

Comments that followed the presentation were that Steamboat's economy is better than the rest of Routt County. Oak Creek, Hayden, and Yampa areas are in worse condition than Steamboat. The mining industry and farmers are really in distress. Everything possible must be done to improve the economics of Routt County.

All present felt that Routt County should proceed rapidly with the application of proposed projects. Commissioner Kenney appointed Bob Hammons to contact representatives of all phases of industry, and representatives from each area in the County, and to form a group to work with Planning Staff, the County Administrator, and John Hess from NWCOG in developing proposed projects and the application to USEDA.

EN RE: RESOLUTIONS

Commissioner Fisher moved to approve Resolution # 87-P-004, Special Use Permit Amendment for Grace Construction Company, as written and as agreed upon. Commissioner Dorr seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

Commissioner Fisher moved to approve Resolution # 87-P-005, Special Use Permit for Vacation of Public Right-of-Way, and Resubdivision of Certain Lots in South Shore at Stagecoach for the Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dorr and was approved unanimously.

Commissioner Fisher moved to approve Resolution # 87-P-006, Special Use Permit for Gravel Pit and Concrete Batch Plant - Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District. Commissioner Dorr seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

EN RE: ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH/PLANNING STAFF/DISCUSSION OF AIR QUALITY REGULATIONS

Environmental Health Officer Mike Zopf, Planning Administrator Steve Fry, and Staff Planner Caryn Fox were present for this meeting.

Mr. Zopf explained that he gets numerous complaints regarding air pollution over which he has no control. His only alternative is to pass them on to Scott Miller with the Colorado Department of Health in Grand Junction.

Mr. Zopf would like to be able to regulate Special Use Permits and enforce state laws regarding air pollution, or to incorporate these laws into the zoning regulations. Mr. Zopf stated that he needs a person certified to test capacity levels, however he does not have money budgeted for this certification. In order for his Department to be able to enforce these laws, policy needs to be set. Mr. Zopf presented a letter to the Board for signature requesting delegation of authority.

Mr. Zopf explained that the City Ordinance only pertains to wood burning stoves. Agriculture burns are also exempt. Mr. Zopf is most interested in the Special Use permits regarding gravel pits and asphalt plants. There would be County enforcement of state regulations regarding fugitive dust and smoke from industrial & commercial uses, and roads.

Mr. Zopf and Ms. Fox were directed to meet with John Vanderbloemen to draw up a draft regulation for review. The Board did not sign the letter delegating authority to Mr. Zopf.

Mr. Zopf and County Engineer Lou Gabos had gone to the existing South Routt Landfill and found there to be no alternate access to the site. They had also looked at the #9 site for a landfill on RCR 179. Mr. Zopf feels there is another site north of the #9 site which would be better. Mr. Gabos is generating cost figures for access roads. Letters have been sent to the Town Boards regarding closure of the South Routt Landfill.

EN RE: PREHEARINGS

Staff Planner Caryn Fox briefed the Board on hearings that will be coming before them soon. (1) A five year review of the Mobile Premix Special Use Permit, (2) A Special Use Permit for the relocation of 230 KV lines by Colorado Ute, and (3) McCoy Aggregates Extension of Special Use Permit Commencement Date.

No further business coming before the Board, same adjourned, sine die.

They also felt it was Moore's responsibility to have the equipment here, or pay the lease on a machine to use until the new machine arrives.

EN RE: ROAD AND BRIDGE/GENERAL

Commissioner Fisher explained to Mr. Rhembrandt the situation regarding Tom Hail and the MLRB. (see January 26, 1987 minutes). Mr. Rhembrandt advised he would submit a memo regarding two \$2,800.00 projects to the Board next week.

Russell Rose, who lives on ROR 56, and whose property borders 56C was present to request a new survey and road alignment. He feels the property owners across the road have built their fence in the County right of way, which has caused the road to move onto his property. The Board directed Mr. Rhembrandt, Mr. Hixon, and Mr. Gabos to look at the situation and return with recommendations.

There was discussion on the plans for this summer. Mr. Rhembrandt is working on proposed projects at this time. Commissioner Kenney stated there will probably be a landfill to open this summer also.

There was discussion on whether the airports should be billed for labor from the County shop. It was felt that the airports should be billed for labor the same as other departments.

EN RE: BOND RELEASE/OILMAN

Planning Administrator Steve Fry, and Staff Planner Caryn Fox were present for this meeting.

Caryn Fox briefed the Board on the Bond Release. The permit was issued in 1977 to Trend Oil. In 1979, the permit was transferred to Oilman, who drilled that year. Oilman had submitted a reclamation bond in the amount of \$2,000. Ms. Fox was unable to get to the site, however land owner Bob Barnes indicated the site was reclaimed in 1979, and has submitted a letter to that effect.

The Board voted unanimously to release the bond for Oilman.

EN RE: BOND RELEASE/VOYAGER PETROLEUM

Staff Planner Caryn Fox advised the Board that the Voyager Petroleum is requesting a bond release for a well located on property belonging to Hocking-Dowling south west of Tow Creek. Wayne Morton leases the land and has advised there is no problem with the reclamation. Ms. Fox has requested a letter of release from Mr. Morton which she has not yet received.

Commissioner Fisher made a motion to table the bond release until a letter is received from the lessee or from the land owner. Commissioner Dorr seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

EN RE: SOCIAL SERVICES/RESOLUTION

On January 26, 1987 a resolution had been approved by the Board for Social Services to transfer funds in the Social Services Budget. The resolution had been in error. A new resolution was presented to the Board requesting an increase for IV-D Adm in the amount of \$400.00, and decrease Reg. ADM. \$400.00. This resolution is effective retroactive to December 1986.

The Board voted unanimously to approve Resolution # 87-003.

EN RE: UPPER YAMPA WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT/SUP/GRAVEL PIT AND CONCRETE BATCH PLANT

Planning Director Steve Fry, Staff Planner Caryn Fox, County Attorney John Vanderbloemen, and Phil Eggleston, representative of the Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District were present for this hearing.

The following is background information on the petition. The Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District received final approval for the Stagecoach Reservoir project Sept. 18, 1986 on the Environmental Impact Statement and from the State Engineers Office.

The Construction of the dam will entail the use of roller compacted concrete, which the petitioner desires to produce on site.

The gravel and concrete will be used on-site for the Stagecoach Reservoir project. Some gravel may be used on county roads that will be relocated due to the reservoir project.

The location for the proposed Gravel Pit and Concrete Batch Plant is in the SW4 SW4 Section 29, Township 4 North, Range 84 West, and the pit will be located in what will be the bottom of the Stagecoach Reservoir. The proposed site will be 15 acres, and it is in Agriculture/Forestry zone.

The Stagecoach Reservoir will be located 17 miles south of Steamboat Springs and 4.5 miles east of Oak Creek. Access to the site is from County Road 14 and from Colorado 131.

Ms. Fox advised that Planning Commission had unanimously recommended approval of the Special Use Permit with 12 standard conditions and 9 specific conditions.

Attorney Vanderbloemen asked about MLRB reclamation permit. Mr. Eggleston answered that there would be no reclamation since the gravel pit would be covered by the water in the reservoir.

Commissioner Kenney moved to approve a Special Use Permit for Gravel Pit and Concrete Batch Plant to be located in the SW4 SW4 Section 29, Township 4, North, Range 84 West, subject to the 12 standard conditions and 9 specific conditions set forth by Planning Commission. Commissioner Dorr seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

EN RE: MALLON OIL/TEMPORARY RELOCATION OF ROR. # 50.

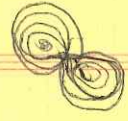

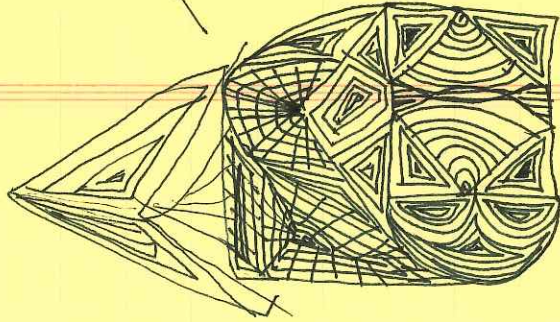

MOTION: Mr. Ralston offered a motion to recommend approval of the vacation of public right-of-way, easements for public utilities and drainage, and re-subdivision of portions of the plat of South Shore at Stagecoach that contain Lots 5, 6, 7, 12, 13, 14, 15, a portion of common area 12, and Arapaho Road cul-de-sac as shown on the plat. This approval shall serve as Final Plat approval and is subject to the following conditions:

1. Utility, drainage and trail easements shall be indicated on the plat.
2. The plat shall be filed with the Routt County Clerk and Recorder within five (5) working days of approval by the Board of County Commissioners.

Mr. Rudeen seconded the motion.

VOTE: The motion to recommend approval carried unanimously with the Chair voting.

UPPER YAMPA WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT - Special Use Permit

Mr. Eggleston also represented the petition by the Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District for a gravel pit and cement batch plant in the SW4 SW4 SW4 Section 29, Township 4 North, Range 84 West of the 6th P.M., at the Stagecoach Reservoir project 17 miles south of Steamboat Springs and 4.5 miles east of Oak Creek.

The gravel and concrete will be used on site for the Stagecoach Reservoir project. Some gravel may be used on county roads that will be relocated due to the reservoir project.

Mr. Eggleston said they will offer a dust mitigation plan since this will be a crusher type operation. The dam will be constructed of roller compacted concrete, but the engineers specifications are not explicit about the type of equipment that will be used. There is a possibility that the batched concrete will be transported on a conveyor belt.

Planning Commission Questions

Other than Dave Hall, how close are other houses to the proposed pit?
EGGLESTON: Thelma Moore and Hendersons are the only occupied homes in the area, and they are some distance away.

Will the lake bottom be stripped? EGGLESTON: The specifications don't call for that. CARYN FOX: There is a section in the construction plans that speaks

to clearing and demolition of brush. Caryn read from that section that combustible material that is five feet or more in length and two inches or more in diameter shall be cleared, as shall all areas under and within twenty feet of the dam. However, the construction plans do not speak to when this clearing shall take place. Mr. Eggleston said he did not think the willows are to be moved until the second year. There are very stringent constraints applied to this project by the Army Corps of Engineers.

Do you have plans for settling ponds? EGGLESTON: That is included in the specifications under the State water quality requirements. There is very strict control over the amount of effluent that can go off site. Water through the pipe is closely monitored. That is a typical requirement with dam construction.

Comments from the Audience

John Grace asked how many cubic yards of material will be removed, what the depth of the pit will be, and if the dam is roller compacted. Mr. Eggleston explained the process of compaction, but he did not know the amount of material or depth of the pit.

MOTION: Mr. Rudeen offered a motion to recommend approval of the Special Use Permit request by Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District to mine gravel and operate a concrete batch plant in the SW4 SW4 Section 29, Township 4 North, Range 84 West of the 6th P.M. subject to the following conditions:

Standard Conditions

1. A certificate of liability insurance for a minimum of \$500,000 shall be posted to cover any damages to public and private property, and Routt County shall be named as an additional insured.
2. County roads used for the hauling of minerals must be able to accommodate the proposed additional traffic. All haulage roads must have adequate signage at intersections and any other locations that may require additional signage. All relocated county roads must have adequate dedicated right-of-way and must meet, at a minimum, the Routt County Road Standards.
3. All road and bridge repair and maintenance agreements made with Routt County prior to permit issuance must be adhered to.
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5. The special use permit is valid for the life of the use or until termination of active production, provided it is acted upon within two (2) years of approval.
6. The operation may be reviewed by Planning Staff annually to ensure that all conditions of the permit are being complied with.
7. Any complaints or concerns which may arise from this operation may be

cause for review of the Special Use Permit, at any time, and amendment or addition of conditions, or revocation of the permit if necessary.

8. Hauling shall take place along on-site roads when possible.
9. Sanitary facilities are to be located on or near the extraction site.
10. Routt County has the authority to close any county road at their discretion, if such road surface is in poor condition and would be further damaged by additional use.
11. The permittee shall apply for and receive a Mined Land Reclamation Board permit if required and post a reclamation bond with the MLRB prior to commencing any operations. The permittee shall be responsible for reclamation as set forth by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation guidelines.
12. Weed control shall be exercised on the property as necessary and at least once per year.

Specific Conditions

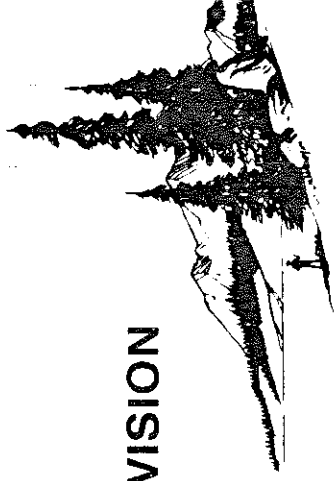
1. The batch plant, crusher and gravel pit shall comply with all applicable Federal and State regulations for emissions, noise and odors.
 2. A dust control plan shall be submitted to Planning Staff, along with emission permits from the Colorado Department of Health, Air Quality Control Division.
 3. Noise levels, smoke, odors, heat, and vibration shall not exceed limits set by Section 8.4 of the Routt County Zoning Resolution.
 4. The groundwater table at the site must be protected from pollutants. Review by the County and State Health Departments may indicate the need for an impervious liner to be placed in a settling pond or some other method of groundwater protection may be necessary. Final plans shall be submitted to planning staff.
 5. Hours shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday.
 6. Equipment and stockpiles in the gravel pit shall be placed and/or anchored to prevent them from floating downstream in the event of a flood.
 7. The Special Use Permit is for the purpose of the Stagecoach Reservoir project construction only.
 8. The Special Use Permit is valid for two years.
 9. Specific plans, as developed by the contractor, for sediment control and hazardous or oily substance control shall be submitted to Planning Staff prior to construction.
Mr. Williams seconded the motion.

Background Information

1. The Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District received final approval for the Stagecoach Reservoir project on September 18, 1986, on the Environmental Impact Statement and from the State Engineers Office.
2. The construction of the dam will entail the use of roller compacted concrete, which the petitioner desires to produce on site.
3. The gravel and concrete will be used on-site for the Stagecoach Reservoir project. Some gravel may be used on county roads that will be relocated due to the reservoir project.

Site Description

1. The Stagecoach Reservoir will be located 17 miles south of Steamboat Springs and 4.5 miles east of Oak Creek.
2. Access to the site is from County Road 14 and Colorado Highway 131.
3. Surface owner: Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District.
4. Mineral owner: Same
5. Natural slope of the site: Relatively flat.
6. Nearest waterway: The Yampa River runs along the southern edge of the gravel pit site.
7. Nearest resident: South Shore lots are approximately one-half (1/2) mile from the gravel pit site. Only one South Shore lot has been built on and it is not adjacent to the future reservoir.

Project Description

1. Gravel will be extracted by use of a drag line. The pit will be about 400 yards from the dam.
2. The gravel will be crushed and separated by size.
3. Equipment on site will include a portable cement batching plant, crusher, bins for different sizes of aggregate, cement silos, water measuring devices, mixers, conveyors, trucks, hoppers, drag line, frontend loaders and graders.
4. Gravel will be hauled to on-site roads and to County Road 16.
5. Concrete will be hauled to on-site locations. Conveyor belts will run from the batch plant to the dam construction site.
6. County Roads 14 and 16 as well as on-site construction roads will be used for hauling concrete and gravel to various reservoir sites including the dam.
7. Commencement of the gravel and concrete operation is expected in September, 1987 and termination is scheduled for November, 1988.
8. Production is expected to occur during the fall and winter months. Fifty percent of the aggregates to be used for roller-compacted concrete will be processed and stockpiled prior to November, 1987.
9. The number of employees will be determined by the batch plant contractor. Bids have not yet been taken for the work.
10. County Road 16 will be partially moved, the bridge will be rebuilt and a portion of the road will be blacktopped.

County Road 18A will also be relocated above the water level of the reservoir. The road will be the main entry road to the reservoir.

County Road 18 that goes from the top of the dam to Service Creek Campground will be improved for one-half (1/2) mile where the hydroelectric plant will be built.
11. A water truck will be used to control dust from hauling, loading, and stockpiling operations.

Environmental Analysis

1. The site is not within a geologic hazard area according to the geologic hazard maps in the Planning Department.
2. The site is within a floodprone area according to the County Planning

Department maps. An Army Corps of Engineers 404 permit is being applied for. The Colorado Department of Health Water Quality Control Division 401 permit has been obtained. Sediment control measures have been established to prevent pollution of the river. These are set forth in the following "Compliance with Zoning" section.

3. Wetland mitigation has been developed for the entire reservoir site and is set forth in the final Environmental Impact statement for the reservoir project.
4. County wildfire mapping indicates that the site is within a low hazard area. All trees, stumps, and brush five feet or more in height, and/or two inches or more in diameter will be cleared from the reservoir area. Brush will be cut to ground level.
5. Wildlife impacts in the area have been addressed during the environmental impact analysis. Destruction of habitat for small mammals and wetlands species will occur, and temporary impacts to the fishery may occur due to the gravel pit.
6. Air pollution from extraction, hauling, stockpiling, loading and associated operations may occur. Noise and visual impacts will most likely occur during the construction of the dam and associated roads.

Reclamation Plan

The gravel pit site will be completely inundated after the dam and roads are constructed.

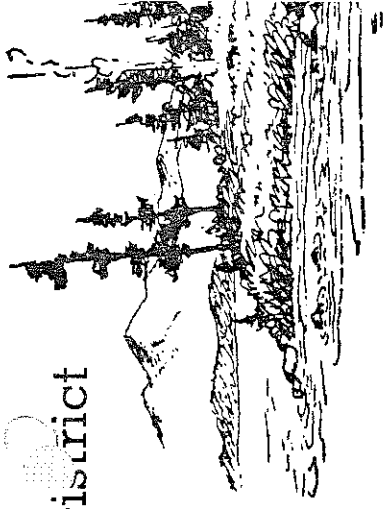

I have provided maps and charts which have also been submitted to the State Mined Land Reclamation Board.

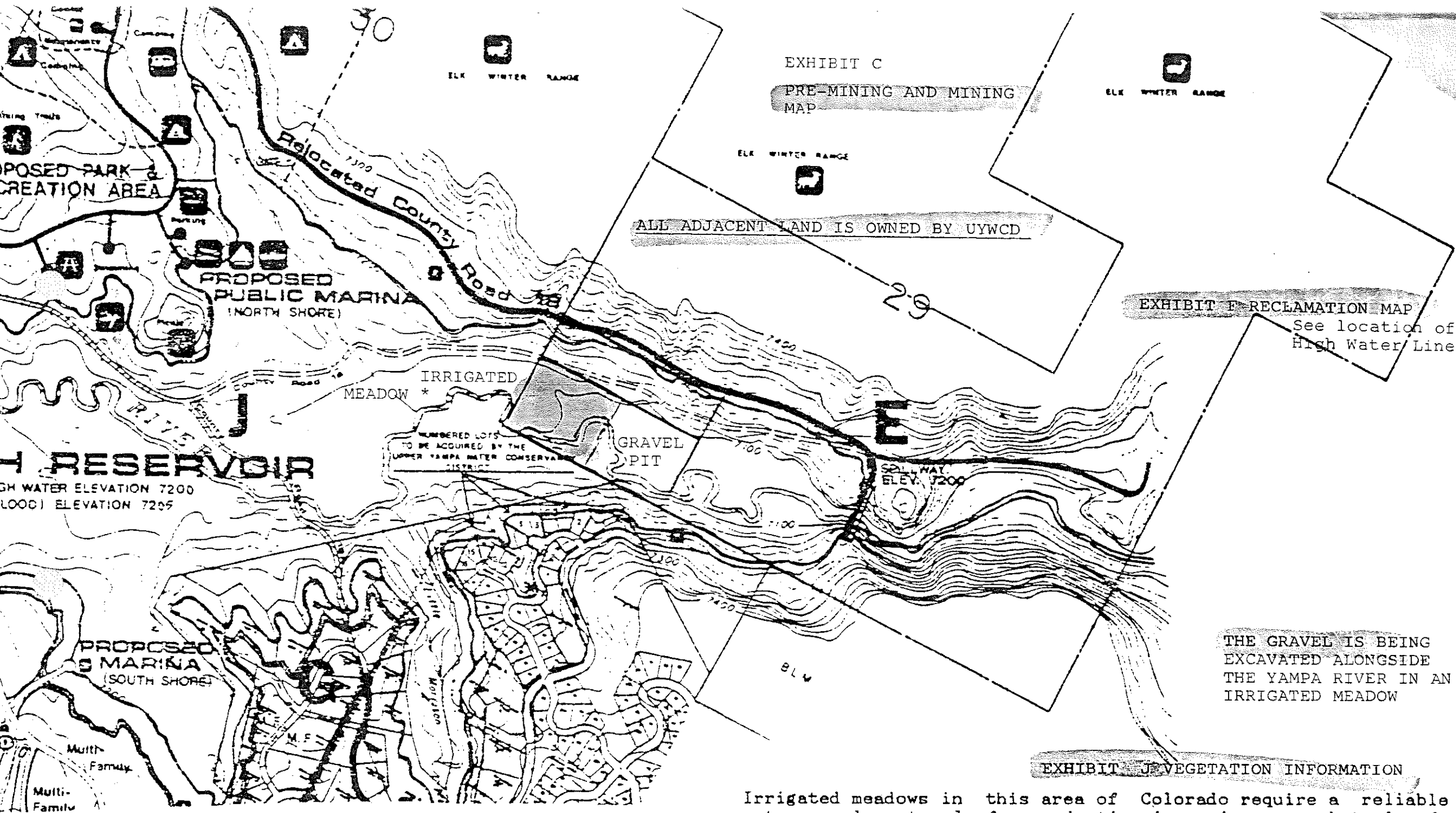
The facilities layout submittal is not known at this time.

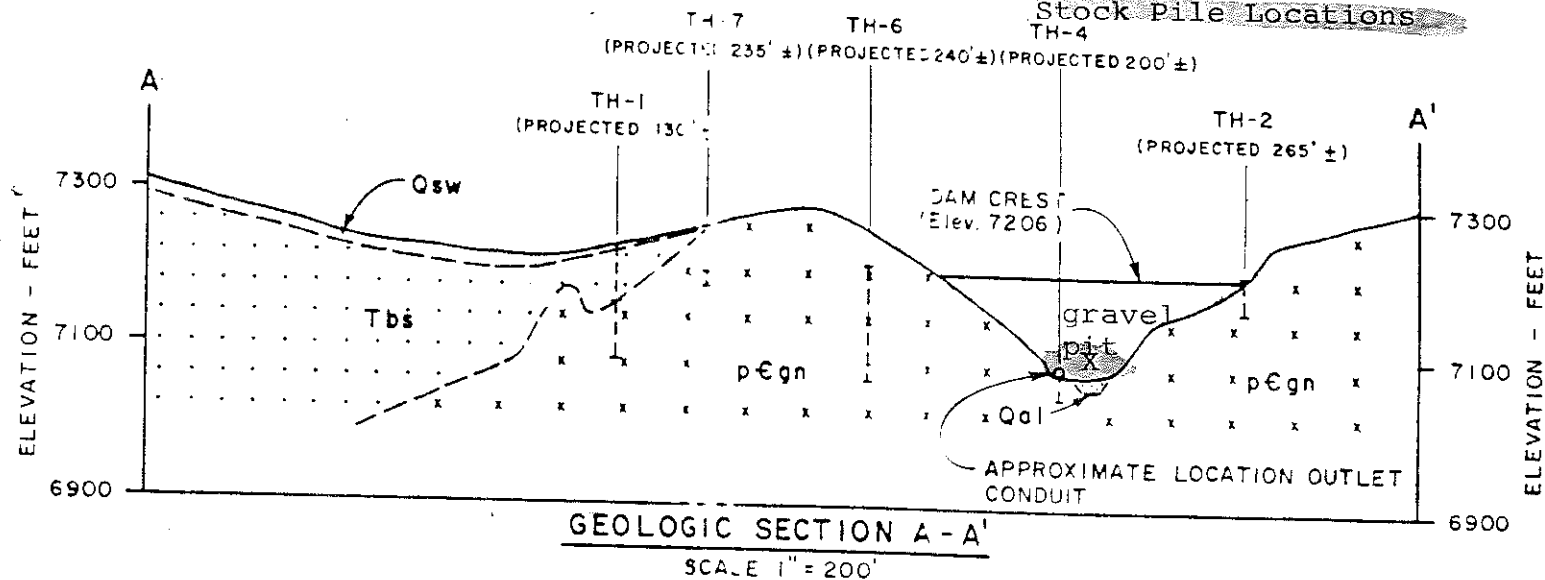

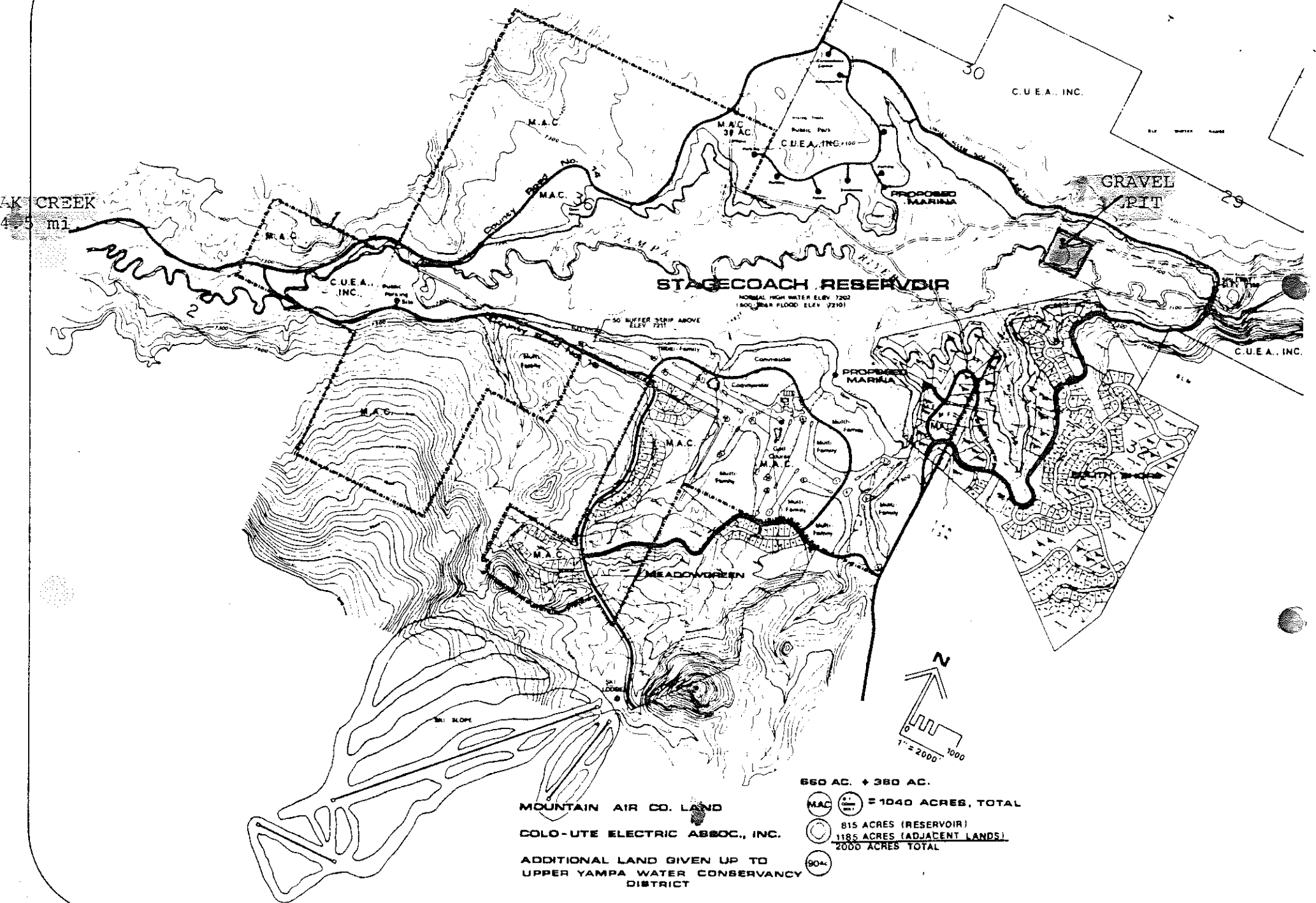

Performance Standards

1. A certificate of liability insurance for a minimum of \$500,000 shall be posted to cover any damages to public and private property, and Routt County shall be named as an additional insured.
2. County roads used for the hauling of minerals must be able to accommodate the proposed additional traffic. All haulage roads must have adequate signage at intersections and at any other locations that may require additional signage. All relocated county roads must have adequate dedicated right-of-way and must meet, at a minimum, the Routt County Road Standards.
3. All road and bridge repair and maintenance agreements made with Routt County prior to permit issuance shall be adhered to.
4. The special use permit is limited to uses and facilities presented in the original project plan. Any additional uses or facilities must be applied for in a new or amended application.
5. The special use permit is valid for the life of the use or until termination of active production, provided it is acted upon within two (2) years of approval.
6. The operation will be reviewed every five (5) years to ensure that all conditions of the permit are being complied with.
7. Any complaints or concerns which may arise from this operation may be cause for review of the Special Use Permit, at any time, and amendment or addition of conditions, or revocation of the permit if necessary.

8. Hauling shall take place on State or Federal highways when possible when private haul roads are not used.
9. Sanitary facilities are to be located on or near the extraction site.
10. Routt County has the authority to close any county road at their discretion if such road surface is in poor condition and would be further damaged by additional use.
11. The permittee shall apply for and receive a Mined Land Reclamation Board permit and post a reclamation bond with the MLRB prior to commencing any operations. The permittee shall be responsible for reclamation as set forth by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation guidelines.
12. Weed control shall be exercised on the property as necessary and at least once per year.

Dear Commission Members,

The Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District is herein applying for a Special Use Permit for Gravel Pit and operation of concrete batching plant.

At the start of the construction period in 1987, construction will begin on Stagecoach Reservoir. Weather permitting, work will be completed in the year 1988 and filling will begin with the run-off in Spring 1989.

The gravel pit site will be totally inundated at the conclusion of the construction.

The gravel will be totally used on the site with the exception of the reconstruction of C.R. 16. The Dam will be a ROLLER COMPACTED CONCRETE CONSTRUCTED dam. The purpose of the gravel pit is to provide the aggregate. The gravel pit also will be the source of material for the roads, camp sites, and beach sand for the swim area. None of the material will be sold and hauled to any other area than indicated here.

I have provided maps and charts which have also been submitted to the State Mined Land Reclamation Board.

The facilities layout submittal is not known at this time.

ALL OF THE SURROUNDING PROPERTY TO THE GRAVEL PIT SITE IS OWNED BY THE UPPER YAMPA WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT.

Because the District is a State Government, it is entitled to the protections provided such entities under the Governmental Immunity Act. Contractors and Sub-Contractors will be required to provide A Certificate of Insurance in an amount of not less than \$500,000.00 and will name Routt County as additional named Insured.
